

## A fresh school year for Lekòl Sen **Trinite students and staff**

The students and staff returned to Lekòl Sen Trinite the second week of September. All are happy to be back in the classroom and to see their friends again.

This year, LST will educate 241 students in preschool through ninth grade. There are 192 returning students and 49 students who are attending LST for the first time. The student population is made up of 134 girls and 107 boys. The youngest preschool student is 3 years old. The oldest student is 20.

LST is a tuition-free school that serves a wide range of students and gives them opportunities not only to flourish academically, but also to participate in extra-curricular activities that include, dance, drumming, music, art, cooking classes, and karate. Many of these students would not be able to attend school if it were not for LST. LST also provides all books and supplies needed by the students. Each student also receives a hot meal each day.

We are immensely proud to report that the first class of ninth graders graduated from LST in July. A week after graduation, the eight LST graduates had to take a multiday government exam. The result of this exam determines whether or not they are allowed continue their education. All eight students from LST passed their exams! The national average for passing these rigorous exams was 80%. The LST students' 100% pass rate is something to celebrate and be proud of. Their accomplishment shows the quality of education at LST and what a first-rate education can do for students.

# Keeping bodies moving at Wings of Hope

Keeping bodies moving at Wings of Hope is a core mission for the home. Physical therapy helps to build muscles and skills for residents with physical disabilities. Movement helps channel energy for residents with mental and behavioral challenges. Fun and play make everyone's lives better.

Physical therapy sessions happen daily Monday to Friday, with each resident receiving individualized



programming to meet their



needs, goals, and abilities. Wings of Hope has a two-person physical therapy department to ensure all Wings residents can receive the therapy sessions they need.

With a limited amount of equipment, the staff at Wings of Hope get creative by using everything as an opportunity for physical therapy. In Haiti there is a word — "degaje" which means "do the best with what you have." That is something the physical therapy staff practices every day as they get bodies moving, improve skills, and have fun with the Wings of Hope residents.

Sponsorships for the Wings of Hope residents provide a regular source of support for all the critical programs. They also allow sponsors to follow the progress of Wings residents and are a way to remind the Wings residents they have friends who care about

Sponsorships also may be paid on a monthly basis with a donation of \$35 per month. Since the average annual cost to provide for all a resident's needs is actually \$6,690, the residents have multiple sponsors whenever possible. All residents receive the care, services, and items they need, regardless of the number of sponsors they have.

Sponsors are provided with a biography and a photo of the resident they support, along with multiple mailings throughout the year, enabling them to track progress and deepen their connection.


